MIKE WILDE - DEPARTMENT FOR INFRASTRUCTURE AND TRANSPORT MANAGER NETWORK PLANNING

Prior to joining the department Mike was engaged in the rail freight industry in business development and operational management roles. Mike currently advises on the strategic development of the transport network. Mike will talk about the current projects, planning studies and other initiatives that relate to freight and supply chains and Restricted Access Vehicle network development which are the focus of state strategic and investment planning.

TONI CLARKE LGA - HEAVY VEHICLE ACCESS LIAISON OFFICER

Toni has over 10 years experience with the Department for Infrastructure and Transport in heavy vehicle access and policy. Toni will talk about delivering heavy vehicle services at a local level and how it poses its own unique challenges when balancing efficient freight movement, economic delivery and infrastructure protection. This session will work through learnings from workshops held to date and considerations on managing some of these challenges.

MATTHEW MATRICCIANI - DEPARTMENT FOR INFRASTRUCTURE AND TRANSPORT, PRINCIPAL POLICY OFFICER

Matthew has a civil engineering background and has experience across the private and public industry sectors. He passionately supports growth and productivity of the heavy vehicle industry. As a Senior Heavy Vehicle Access Facilitator, Matthew worked closely with multiple operators to improve heavy vehicle accessibility within South Australia. Matthew's presentation will include the core principles for effective decision making and how to apply a risk based approach for granting access consent for intersections between local government roads and those within the jurisdiction of state and commonwealth government.

JACQUI QUARTON - JLT RISK SOLUTIONS, REGIONAL RISK COORDINATOR

Prior to this Regional Risk Coordinator role, Jacqui spent over 20 years supporting training and OHS advising for the civil, mining and agencies such as BusinessSA, Master Builders Association and SafeworkSA. Jaccqui will present an overview of the roads related projects such as the review of the unsealed roads guide, the Work Zone Traffic Management guidance tool, National Training changes and proposed work going forward.

STEVEN KAESLER OAM - THE BAROSSA COUNCIL, MANAGER ENGINEERING SERVICES

Steven is a civil engineer with 18 years experience in Urban Development prior to joining the Barossa Council where for the last 14 years he has managed Engineering Services. Steven will be presenting on the purpose and outcomes of the review of bridges that has resulted in successful grant applications for the "bridges for renewal program"
