6. BACKGROUND

Media Training is an essential skill, especially for Mayors and CEOs as they are regularly required to respond to the media on behalf of a range of issues. The training provided by journalist and media personality Graeme Goodings was delivered on 13th and 14th August 2025 at the Adelaide Plains Council Chamber.

Report Title: N&YLGA Waste and Resource Recovery Strategy 2021-2026

I. REPORT PURPOSE

The N&YLG Waste and Resource Recovery Strategy 2021-2026 (Attachment E) is listed in the Annual Business Plan 2025-2026 for review and update, as a key action for the Northern & Yorke Local Government Association.

2. RECOMMENDATION

That the N&YLGA Board approves the updating of the N&YLGA Waste and Resource Recovery Strategy 2021-2026 to be carried out by Rawtec Pty Ltd; to a value of \$17,920 ex GST. As per the proposal from Rawtec Pty Ltd dated 18th August 2025 (Attachment F)

3. BACKGROUND

The N&YLGA Waste and Resource Recovery Strategy 2021-2026 was originally commissioned by the board to be carried out by Rawtec. This strategy was prompted in 2021 by the then Legatus Group of councils to assist with future actions regarding Waste Management for Regional Local Governments in SA. The Legatus Group identified a series of targeted projects that leverage advocacy and collaboration activities to deliver targeted outcomes for the region and as such commissioned the Legatus Group Waste and Resource Recovery Strategy 2021-2026 and its Action Plan. The strategy is now due for a review and to be updated to reflect progress against actions and to identify activities going forward for the benefit of Northern & Yorke local government councils.

Association Employment Contract

I. REPORT PURPOSE

This report seeks a decision of the following, that in consideration of the performance by the CEO Bridget Ransome since her commencement in the role for Northern & Yorke LGA on 25th November 2024 that her employment contract be approved to move from the current 0.8FTE to a full time 1.0FTE.

2. RECOMMENDATION

That the N&YLGA Board approve the change in employment contract for Bridget Ransome, CEO of Northern & Yorke LGA from 0.8FTE to 1.0FTE, effective from 1st September 2025 so that she can fully carry out the duties required of this role for the Northern & Yorke Local Government Association Member Councils.

3. BACKGROUND

Since her appointment as CEO to the Northern & Yorke LGA, Bridget has taken on the requirements of the role with a focus on adding value to member councils. She has reviewed internal operating procedures of the association and has improved the way in which the association continues to be managed. Other initiatives have included the following:

- Updated and changed the financial services operator for the association, which has led to improved and smoother financial operations
- Currently reviewing all policies, procedures and updating them and creating an operational manual for the association
- Reviewed all contractors providing services to the association and rectified where over-charging was occurring
- Met all reporting and governance requirements for board, advisory committees and regular SAROC meetings
- Introduced an electronic e:news which is now being copied by other LGAs
- Formulated an expansive advocacy plan, which is also now being copied by other LGAs
- Formulated a Communications Plan for the region including an update of brand, website and social media which has commenced (again being copied by other LGAs)
- Provided media training to Mayors and CEOs
- Encouraged our Sponsorship of the Small-Town Reinvention conference and she will be an MC for part of the conference this September
- Applied for and secured the following grants:
 - \$47,300 for 1:1 business advisory service for drought impacted businesses
 - \$40,000 for projects: Waste webinar series, Get Home Safe Foundation, and Yorke Peninsula community township plans for 4 townships impacted by Algal Bloom

- \$11,000 for Northern Areas Council to provide business mentoring to local businesses impacted by the closure of Golden North
- Provided Round 2 support for the SLRP, including scoring grants and updating grant information to finalise applications which has resulted in \$6.5m of road projects for the region.
- Applied for and secured \$38,500 for Regional Childcare Desert Advocacy Project to further the advocacy work done by 23 councils within the Grey electorate.

Recently the CEO was asked to also take on investment attraction initiatives in partnership with the RDA Yorke and Mid North, which includes the creation of an investment attraction plan for the whole region. Along with other projects including the Waste & Resource Recovery Strategy review and supporting our communities impacted by Algal Bloom, drought and business closures it is unrealistic for us to continue to expect Bridget to work on a 0.8FTE basis. I am aware that she is also accruing significant TOIL hours which is now at a total of 55 hours.

With N&YLGA being the largest association in South Australia, we are expecting our CEO to work on a part-time basis, whilst the CEOs of both Eyre Peninsula and Murraylands are both employed full-time and with less member councils to support. I believe it is incumbent upon us to ensure that our CEO has the capacity to carry out her duties without part-time restrictions.

We hired Bridget to advocate for us and judging by this list of activities she has taken on I believe, well and truly she accepted our challenge, and she should be rewarded for the good work she is doing on our behalf both in time and remuneration.
